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- Water
- Dishwashing soap

## Bubble art greeting cards

What better way to prepare for the new year than to have a stack of hand-made greeting cards to give to your loved ones on special occasions.

1. Mix a few drops of dishwashing soap into the water.
2. Mix food colouring into the water.
3. Use the straw and blow into the water to create the bubble effect.
4. Place the drawing paper on top of the cup and lift it gently.
5. Repeat step 4 till the drawing paper is filled with bubbly designs.
6. Leave paper to dry.
7. Once dried, cut the paper into any desired design and decorate with glitter and sequins.
8. Lastly write a message and voila! Share it with your loved ones.

1. Pour half a cup of white glue into a disposable cup and mix about 5 spoonsful of Tide detergent.

2. Scoop the 'snow' into 7 equal parts into the cups.

- Vegetable oil
  - Water
  - Transparent jar/cup
  - Green and red food colouring
  - Dropper

  2. Fill the next  $\frac{1}{4}$  with vegetable oil.
  3. Drop green and red food colouring in then sit back and watch the magic.
